- These things change, so always check in advance
- You normally always need copies of passport and passport photos (preferably white background)
- Many embassies refuse to help you because you are not a resident of the country you are in, try to convince them to help you, get a letter of your embassy and try to speak to the ambassador if you have to
- Normally it is best to already have the visa before you enter the country right before the country you want to visit - visa fees are usually higher there because it is closeby, lots of business people go and they can just charge more
